- Police Report Thorpe End 1, Little Plumstead 8, Great Plumstead 2 (May 2021)
- County Councillor Report Jerome Mayhew MP will be in Little Plumstead on the 29th July at 2pm to talk with residents and visit the Walled Garden. Councillor Mackie will recommend that there is a block of time set aside to speak about the Flatlands' issues. There are new signs and depth gauges on Green Lane North (under the bridge). The detailed design and agreements will take place over the summer in readiness for delivery in the winter months. Highways have put together a full drainage scheme from Hare Road to the Witton Run together with other schemes and has visited Sandhole Lane to review flooding there. The works in Thorpe End will being soon, thank you to all residents in advance for their patience as these key works are undertaken. The mini roundabout will be slightly raised as will the pedestrian crossing to make the more visible and safer. Plans for the feasibility studies remain on track. Highways will take account of the trees. County Council has announced that £29m of this years £41m highways budget will be directed to new paths, cycle ways and pothole repairs, Councillor Mackie will be lobbying for this area. Free school meals will be extended throughout the summer holidays. Councillor Mackie extended his sincere thanks to the head, teachers, governors, parents and children who have navigated this last academic year. Norfolk Libraries has set this years reading challenge for children (please visit the Norfolk libraries website for more details). PC Mason our local beat officer has been out and about in the parish and at Broadland Business Park. Councillor Mackie has raised the issues of last summer with noise nuisance with the new Police and Crime Commissioner.
- **District Councillor Report** Broadland Community at Heart Lottery has raised more than £15,000 for local good causes. Tickets are only £1 per ticket. Chances of winning weekly cash prizes up to £25,000 and enter before 28 August and be in with a chance to with a Luxury Forest Staycation. Government funding of over £8m will contribute to the Food Innovation Centre Broadland Council are building on the Food Enterprise Park near Honingham. Building commences later this month and the first tenants are expected in the summer of 2022. Nominations for this year' community at hearts awards opens on 20th July (www.southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk/communityatheart), closing date 12th September. Marriott's Way 10k fun run/walk is starting in Aylsham and finishing in Reepham. This year's event is sponsored by Saffron Housing Trust. Design and Enhancement Awards nominations open on the 19th July details www.southnorfolkandbroadland.gov.uk. Councillor Vincent confirmed that Broadland District Council are prepared should a Covid third wave hit, numbers are being closely monitored. Councillor Vincent confirmed that Flatlands have not completed all of the works contained within the Action Plan. If any resident is unhappy with the invoice, it needs to be disputed directly with Flatlands. Councillor Heath confirmed that

Flatlands have cut some areas which are actually cut and maintained by Broadland District Council and the residents.

• Public Participation – A resident raised why an objection on the planning application for 16b Peachman Way was not raised for the fencing when this was previously objected to on an neighbouring plot. The Clerk agreed that this is most likely been an oversight as our objections centered around lighting of the area. Little Plumstead Primary School is concerned about the trees on the Cripps owned woodland neighbouring the land, the Parish Council urged the school to contact Cripps directly about any trees especially if the numbers were visible. The Councillors agreed that we would write to Broadland District Council to ensure that Cripps have fulfilled all of their obligations in the woodlands before it is transferred into a management company. A resident reported that there were a number of trees which were overhanding pathways in Thorpe End, the Clerk confirmed that if details of where these trees were located we could write to the owners to ask them to trim them back.

6. TO CONSIDER PLANNING APPLICATIONS

7. TO DISCUSS PARISH PROJECTS

a. Church Road - Amenity Land

The Clerk will contact Broadland Planning about the area. It needs to be maintained by the developer as it has not been transferred to the Parish Council or (we believe) Norfolk County Council. The Clerk will contact Norfolk County Council/Highways about their portion of the land and confirm whether it has been transferred over as it is becoming overgrown.

b. Padgate Play Area – Fencing and boundary hedge

This area will be kept under observation. The vegetation has grown and filled in the gap in the hedge.

c. Rosebery Fields

Councillor Johnson will going out for another quote to clear the area. Unfortunately, only one quote has been received with one withdrawing and the other two not responding. The quotations received do not include the wild area. The Parish Council agreed to hold an extraordinary meeting shortly to discuss the quotes for this area.

8. TO DISCUSS POTENTIAL NEW DEFIBRILLATOR - LITTLE PLUMSTEAD

Councillor Bullen proposed putting a defibrillator on the outside wall of the Walled Garden for use by the residents in The Glade, the Willows and the neighbouring roads as the nearest ones are either Great Plumstead Village Hall or Little Plumstead Village Hall. The defibrillator and cabinet will cost £1500 (plus the cost of an electrician for mains power to the box). The Councillors agreed for the box to be unlocked. Proposed – Councillor Carty and Seconded – Councillor Edwards. (To be funded by CIL monies).

The code for the Great Plumstead box to be written on the outside.

Councillor Bullen confirmed that new pads and batteries were required for the Thorpe End and Little Plumstead (Village Hall) defibrillators at a cost of £150 each (£300 in total as they come as a set). Agreed.
